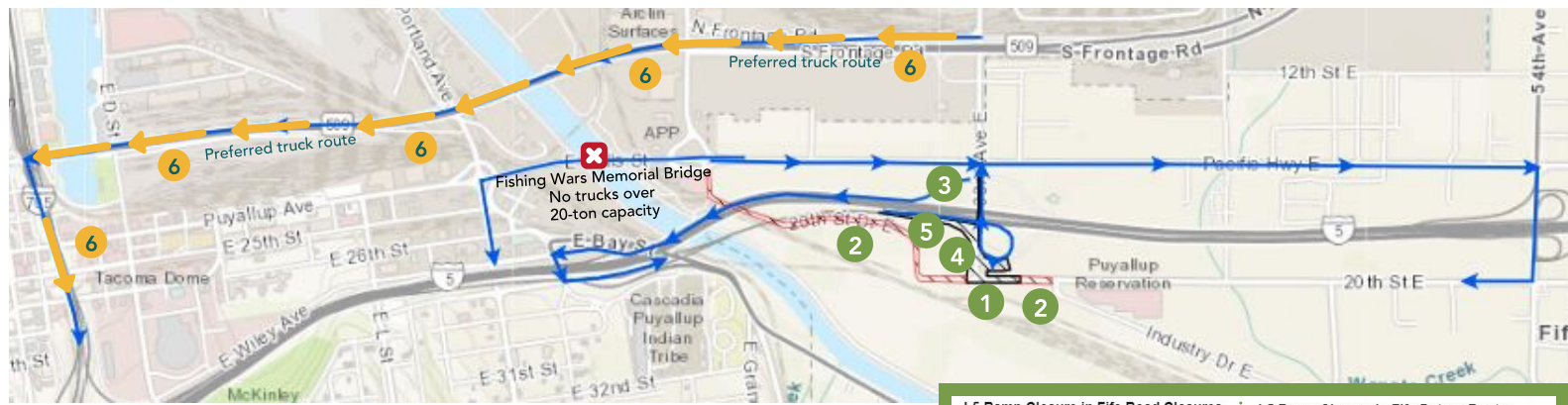


# I-5 ramp closure at Port of Tacoma Road in Fife



Drivers should be aware of a significant I-5 freeway ramp closure on Port of Tacoma Road (POTR) from March 6 to March 23, 2020 in Fife. The closure, due to a vital environmental cleanup project, will include:

I-5 Ramp Closure in Fife Road Closures Area	I-5 Ramp Closure in Fife Detour Routes
Full Road Closure	Suggested route for cars
Local Access Only	Suggested route for trucks

- 1 No I-5 access at all from 20th Street East in Fife.
- 2 20th Street East closed from Industry Drive East to beyond POTR. Only business traffic will have access.
- 3 Southbound I-5 access will be open for drivers entering I-5 from Pacific Highway side of POTR.
- 4 NB I-5 on-ramp access will be closed 10 days, but reopening March 16 from Pacific Highway side of POTR.
- 5 Northbound I-5 Exit 136-A will be closed. Exit 136-B will be open for northbound I-5 exiting to POTR.
- Fishing Wars Memorial Bridge (FWM) closed to trucks over 20-ton capacity.
- 6 Truck drivers from the Port of Tacoma should take SR 509 to I-705, due to FWM Bridge weight restriction.

## BACKGROUND OF CLOSURE

The closure is required for a substantial environmental cleanup project. On August 18, 2016, a fuel truck overturned as it made a left-hand turn onto northbound I-5 at Port of Tacoma Road. The overturned truck spilled about 7,500 gallons of fuel.

The truck owner's insurance company funded an investigation of that spilled fuel, and paid for a contractor to dig out 4,000 tons of contaminated soil that was not under pavement. About 6,800 gallons of that fuel spill has been removed to date, but about 700 gallons remain at the site beneath the road. A temporary solution to prevent the migration of the fuel and its impacts was implemented with the intention of an eventual permanent remedy.

That time for a permanent fix is now. Crews will be removing the remaining contamination from beneath the road and existing culvert at the spill site.
